CURRICULUM

The curriculum is based on the six competencies for community college leaders delineated by AACC. These competencies include organizational strategy, resource management, communication, collaboration, community college advocacy and professionalism. Specific topics will include charting career pathways, resume building and interviewing techniques, mentoring, managing fiscal resources and fundraising.
